SCOOTERS, BIKES AND HELMETS

Just a reminder that if children are coming to school on their bikes or scooters, please can parents ensure they also wear a helmet.

Helmets are critical for reducing the risk of serious head injuries, which can have lifelong consequences. They protect the brain, face and head during falls or accidents, far beyond preventing minor scrapes.

Studies show helmets reduce head injury risk by 63-88%, severe traumatic brain injury by 60-69% and fatal head injury by 65-73% for cyclists of all ages. For children, this protection is vital during high-energy activities.

Who is Eligible For Free School Meals?

Free school meals are a statutory benefit. This means that if you qualify you have a legal right to free school meals for your child or children.

If you have a child attending a Sheffield school or maintained nursery, you may be entitled to free school meals if you receive any of these benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit as long as you have a yearly household income of less than £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs) and do not get Working Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)


