#### Income Based Free School Meals for Children

From the 1st of April 2025, the Government's transitional protection arrangements for the income based Free School Meals will end. If you believe you may qualify for free school meals under the benefits system (this is different to Universal Free School Meal entitlement which every child in FS and KSI receives) we would kindly request that you apply via this link Free school meals | Sheffield City Council, or contact the school office staff who will be happy to complete the request on your behalf.

Applying prior to the 1st April means that, if your application is successful, your child will then remain on free school meals for the remainder of their time at primary school (until the end of Y6), regardless of your financial circumstances changing. A successful application after the 1st of April is also valid, however the claim is no longer protected, resulting in your child no longer qualifying for free school meals if your financial situation changes. Free school meals also entitles the child to free school milk and, currently, supermarket vouchers to redeem during each of 6 school holidays.

Good attendance and punctuality habits are vital if pupils are to achieve their maximum potential.

Ecclesfield Primary School is committed to working with parents/carers and pupils to ensure that each pupil benefits from the academic, personal and social opportunities available to them during their years with us. In order to promote and recognise good attendance, we use a range of strategies;

Class attendance figures are shared with all the children and staff as part of Friday achievement assembly. There are rewards for the class with the highest attendance.

Improved attendance is recognised and rewarded in class by the teacher on a 1:1 basis and also with our inclusion and attendance team.

Daily Dojo points are also given to children who are in school on time.

Termly certificates are awarded to pupils with above 96.6%
